Source Classification

An engine is considered Existing if:

Engines that commence construction or reconstruction on or after the above dates are considered **New Engines** under NESHAP Subpart ZZZZ.

An engine's applicable date is when the source's owner or operator has entered into a contractual obligation to undertake and complete, within a reasonable amount of time, a continuous program for the on-site installation of the engine. This date is not affected by changes in engine ownership.

*For the purposes of this table, "built" means "commenced construction or reconstruction," as defined in 40 CFR § 63.2.

Notification of Intent to Test

Sources must give at least 60 days advance notice of any planned performance test.

Notification of Compliance Status

For initial compliance demonstrations that **do not include** performance tests, sources must submit their Notification of Compliance Status within 30 days of the demonstration.

For initial compliance demonstrations that **do include** performance tests, sources must submit their Notification of Compliance Status within 60 days of the test.

Notifications are not required for existing RICE less than 100 HP, existing emergency RICE, or existing RICE that are not subject to any numerical emission standards.

Compliance Reports

Semiannual Reports

- First Report
 - Must cover the period beginning on your applicable compliance date and ending on June 30 or Dec 31, whichever comes first, following the end of the first calendar half after your applicable compliance date.
- Subsequent Reports
 - Must cover the reporting period from Jan 1 June 30 or July 1 Dec 31.
- Reports must be postmarked or delivered no later than July 31 or Jan 31, whichever comes first.

Annual Reports

- First Report
 - Must cover the period beginning on your applicable compliance date and ending Dec 31.
- Subsequent Reports
 - Must cover the reporting period from Jan 1 Dec 31.
- Reports must be postmarked or delivered no later than Jan 31.
