# What do Endangered & Threatened species have to do with getting a CSW Permit???



### Nongame & Endangered Species Conservation Act

- NESCA is like Endangered Species Act (ESA)
- All federally listed species are state listed...but not vice versa
- Prohibits "take"
  - harass, harm, etc...
  - applies to everyone
- Currently 31 state-listed species in Nebraska

### **NESCA Consultation Requirement**

State permitted/funded actions must consult with NGPC to ensure they will not jeopardize the continued existence of threatened and endangered species or result in destruction of critical habitat for such species

Neb. Rev. Stat. § 37-807 (3)

# Completing the CERT -

- Engaging in consultation on behalf of Nebraska Department of Environment & Energy
- Submitting the completed CERT Report with CSW Permit Application demonstrates compliance with NESCA

#### **NESCA Consultation**

#### **Consultation Process:**

- Work with projects to avoid "take"
- Designed to protect project proponents & state agencies
- Consult on both state and federally funded/permitted projects in Nebraska
- Common permitting actions include 404 permit/401 Water quality certification and NPDES (CSW/ISW)

Users can also make and download maps using the existing data layers or in combination with layers they upload. To use the CERT for conservation planning, click the Map tab above. For information on querying data layers or making maps, click Resources under the Help tab.

NGPC/USFWS Environmental Review: To be able to submit proposed projects for environmental review, users are required to register and login. To register, click on <u>Create New Account</u>. After logging in, users will be able to create and submit a project for review. To get started, click the Help tab at the top of the page, select <u>Resources</u>, and read the 'Creating and Submitting a Project for Review document. The review will evaluate the project's location and activities for potential impacts to state and federally listed threatened and endangered species as well as other at-risk species.
