Air Quality

- Title 129 Proposal in June 2015
 - Streamline Construction Permit Process
 - Authority to Issue General Construction Permits
 - "Notice & Go"
- Source Categories Under Consideration:
 - Concrete Batch Plants
 Surface Coating
 - Hot Mix Asphalts Plants o Incinerators

- - Emergency Engines o Grain Elevators & Dryers
- Crushing & Screening



Emerging Issues (cont'd)

Air Quality

- Clean Power Plan 111(d) Rule
 - EPA expected to finalize June 2015
 - State will work with stakeholders on plan
- Proposed Revisions to Ozone Standard
 - Omaha potentially impacted
 - Monitoring in Grand Island?

Water Quality

- Omaha CSO
- New Ammonia Standards
- Assessing Wastewater Infrastructure Needs (AWIN) Process
 - Evaluating infrastructure needs
 - Examine affordable alternatives
 - Sustainability Risk List and Individual Community Datasheets on NDEQ website, deq.ne.gov
