


**General Permits and Online
Permitting**



NDEQ issues general permits that provide authorization for several types of NPDES regulated discharges.

General permits can be a cost-effective option because a large number of facilities can be covered under a single permit.





A general permit allows the permitting authority to allocate resources in a more efficient manner and provide timelier permit coverage.


In addition, using a general permit ensures consistent permit conditions for comparable facilities.





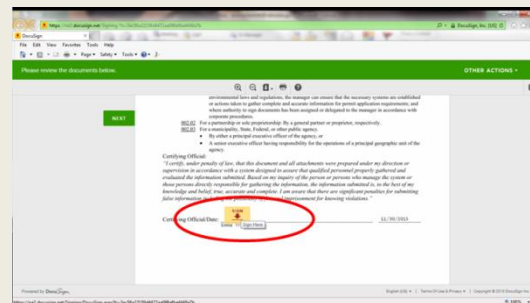
After completing the online NOI, the Certifying Official will receive an email. From here, click on 'Review Document'.



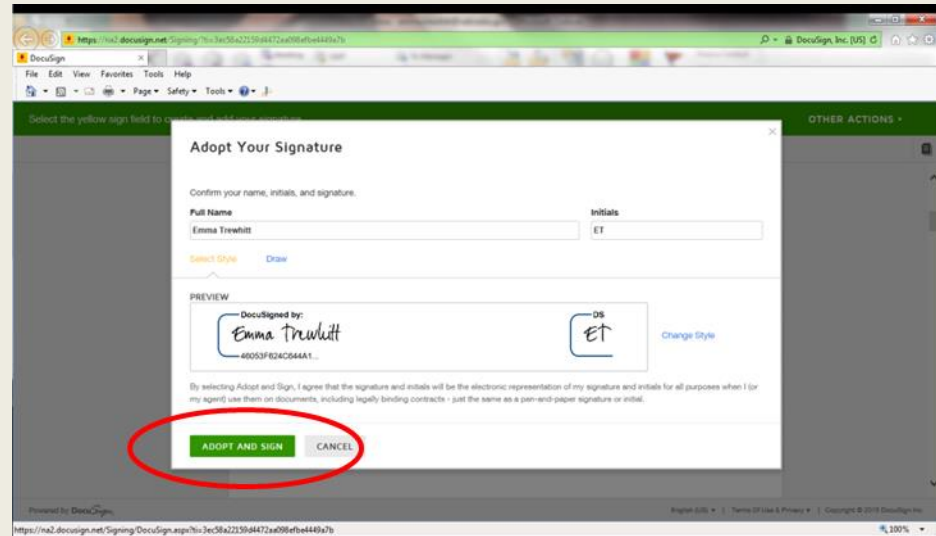
A new web page will open, where you will need to check 'I agree to use electronic records and signatures'. After you have checked that, click 'continue'.



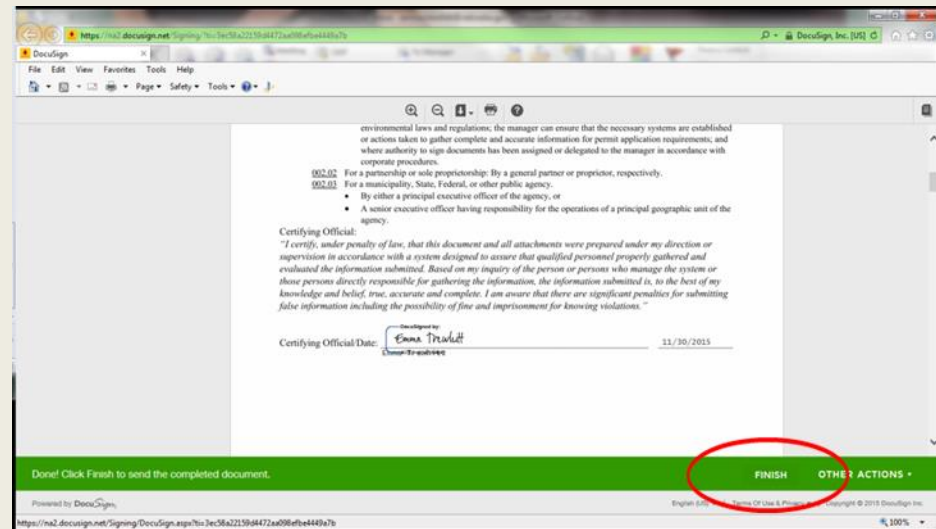
Click on the yellow tab to electronically sign your name.



Once you have electronically signed your name, click the 'Adopt and Sign' button.



Finally, click 'Finish' at the bottom of the screen. At this point, your application will be sent for review, and you will receive an email confirming your signature on the document.



Electronic Submission of Discharge Monitoring Reports

On October 22, 2015, EPA published the Clean Water Act National Pollutant Discharge Elimination System (NPDES) Electronic Reporting Rule, which requires electronic reporting of NPDES information rather than the currently required paper based reports from the permitted facilities. To comply with the federal rule, permittees will be required to submit DMRs electronically using the EPA NetDMR tool starting on December 21, 2016 (Appendix A. of 40 CFR part 127).
