

Community Public Water Systems Status







Updates from Oct. 20

- Valley County has upgraded from a yellow to a green designation.
- NDEE is working with NEMA and other state agencies in the Governor's Long Term Recovery Task Force. This group will work to ensure communities are better positioned to respond to, and recover from, incidents like the storms and floods of spring 2019.
